### **DAIDS Learning Portal**

The Division of AIDS (DAIDS) has developed the DAIDS Learning Portal (DLP) to support clinical researchers, grantees, and collaborators. The DLP is a resource providing the latest DAIDS training information including:

## **Community Partners**

Community Partners (CP) is a cross-network body charged with promoting effective representation of the many communities within which the NIH HIV/AIDS Clinical Trials Networks conduct research. CP is tasked with ensuring effective network representation and articulation of scientific agenda priorities; ethical conduct of clinical trials; community education; communication and information dissemination; respect for community priorities; and continued community participation.

## **The Legacy Project**

The Legacy Project's mission is to build trust and collaboration between historically underrepresented communities most impacted by the domestic HIV epidemic, researchers, and research institutions; enhance cultural competence; and initiate scientific investigation to increase clinical research participation.

# The Women's Research Collaborative

The Women's Research Collaborative (WHRC) is a cross-network working group of the Legacy project comprised of women who are leaders in women's health and HIV from around the United States. With community and staff representatives from all five NIH-funded HIV/AIDS clinical trials networks, this group provides culturally appropriate guidance and leadership in development, implementation, and dissemination of information about HIV research focused on and responsive to the needs of cisgender and transgender women and girls in the United States.
